# **School and Community**

Stafford High School is a four year college preparatory public high school in Stafford Springs, Connecticut, with an enrollment of approximately 400 students. The high school operates on a 181 day academic calendar. Students attend school for 6 ½ hours per day, and maintain 6 credits per year.

The town of Stafford Springs is a rural-suburban community with a population of approximately 12,000 residents. It is located 27 miles northeast of Hartford, CT and about 30 miles southeast of Springfield, Ma. Stafford is also in close proximity to Providence, RI and Boston, MA.

### Academic Program

Our program is driven by our Core Values, Beliefs, and Learning Expectations. Stafford High School, in partnership with students, families and the community strives to nurture learners that are productive, responsible, independent, and dedicated to excellence.
